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1. ORGANIZATION

MultihullCup 2019 is organised through Port Adriano Club de Regattas and is administered under the name MultihullCup.

2. VENUE AND DATES

MultihullCup is held in at Port Adriano on Mallorca between 30th August and 1st September 2019.

3. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the following rules:

Racing Rules of Sailing as defined in the World Sailing 2017-2020.

Current International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea.

The Sailing Instructions issued by the Organizing Authority.

4. ELEGIBILITY AND ENTRY

Entries will be limited to performance sailing multihulls of a length >15m.

The Organising Authority reserves the right to accept entries from yachts out with the above parameters if they deem that it will add to the event.

The entry fee is €1,800.

The Entry Fee should be paid within 7 days of receipt of invoice from MultihullCup.

Entrants are required to present the following during registration on Thursday 29th September 2019 between 1600hrs and 2000hrs at the MultihullCup base, Regatta Village, Port Adriano:

- Registration details signed by Owner or Skipper.
- A valid [ORCmh](#) Measurement Certificate.
- A copy of current Yacht Insurance Certificate including third party cover when racing.
- A list of crew members, with a copy of Passport or ID for all crew members and, where applicable, the appropriate License from the National Authority.
- Name and phone number of contact person ashore.
- Photo release form - signed

5. SCHEDULE

Three days of racing will include two races of approximately 30Nm, and one Record Run of 60Nm (weather dependant).

Each morning the Organising Authority will propose the course for that day. Where possible it will follow the planned schedule detailed in the Sailing Instructions, but they reserve the right to propose alternative courses, as long as the proposal is agreed by a majority of entrants.

7. SCORING

One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

A boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores, there will be no discards.

8. SAFETY

1. The ISAF Offshore Special Regulations Category 3 with life raft compulsorily on board.
2. Participants undertake to carry on board, under their own responsibility, the yacht's updated mandatory documentation, as well as the appropriate certification for handling the yacht and the type of navigation to be carried out.

9. BERTHS

Participating yachts will be entitled to free berthing from 26th August to 2nd September 2019 inclusive.

Where possible, and dependant on length, beam and draft, the yachts will be berthed as close to each other as possible from 29th August to 2nd September inclusive. Port Adriano reserves the right to allow different berths outside of the above times but will make every effort to minimise yacht movements.

10. LIABILITY

All yachts participating in the regatta do so at their own risk and their own liability.

The Organising Committee or any other person or body involved in organising the event, will not be held liable for any losses, damages, injuries or harm sustained by persons or things, both ashore and at sea, as a result of the participation in the regatta referred to in this Notice of Race.

14.3 Attention is drawn to Fundamental Rule 4 DECISION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE RACE, of part 1 of the RRS, establishing:

"The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

11. TROPHIES

The winner's trophy will be presented to the owner of the yacht with the lowest aggregate score over all three races. The trophy is to be kept by the winner, with no requirement to return it for the following year. Trophies for the other entrants will be presented on the same basis as above.



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
